

# **Detained** citizen's transcript released

Man held after DHS says he claimed to enter U.S. illegally

He showed up at the vehicle gate of the Border Patrol station in Tucson, Arizona and presumably tapped the buzzer.

Then, Jose Hermosillo, a U.S. citizen, told an agent he had entered the country illegally.

After two days in custody, Hermosillo told a judge he was a U.S. citizen. But he was still ordered held for seven more days before his family showed up in court to provide proof of that.

In total, Hermosillo was held for 10 days before his release April 17. On that day, prosecutors dropped the misdemeanor charge of illegal entry that was filed against him.

The evidence for that charge, a document shows, came solely from Hermosillo's own lips.

### free kids vaccine program

Dr. Ali Sherif normally gives about 50 doses of the measles vaccine to children each month at his clinic in Hobbs, New Mexico, near the Texas state line.

The number of shots at his clinic has surged about 25% in recent weeks, however, as local parents seek immunizations to protect their toddlers and school-age children from a growing measles outbreak that has infected more than 600 people and led to three deaths.

Like thousands of other doctors across the country, Sherif relies on a little-known federal program to ensure he has those shots on hand for families at no cost to them.
