

HUNGRY IN RURAL PA.

VOLUNTEERS SCRAMBLE TO FILL GAPS AS THE STRUGGLE TO FIND NUTRITIOUS MEALS FOR THOSE IN NEED DEEPENS

CENTRAL CITY, Pa. —

Rain is forecast by lunchtime, so Bonnie Doran, leaning heavily on her cane, packs a pile of flat stones next to the bingo cage in the back of her Subaru.

She gathered the stones from her yard and, in case of rain today, the kids can paint rocks with markers or play bingo at the park, says Ms.

Doran, a 79-year-old retired nurse. Here in Central City — no stoplights, no supermarkets — is a pocket of rural America, two hours southeast of Pittsburgh in Somerset County, where anxiety about having enough food to eat is rising.

In 2023, the most recent year figures are available, 10,070 people in Somerset County experienced low food security —

Shaping AI policy key focus of summit

Bakery Square event aims to boost Pa.'s leading role as a physical AI 'epicenter'

Imagine a not too distant future. You wake up and are greeted by an artificial-intelligence-driven personal robot, one that has been checking your vitals as you sleep, adjusting the temperature inside your home for peak comfort, and is now asking what you'd like for breakfast — or maybe it just knows what you want.

You see that you need to buy more dog food — but you actually don't, because your bot has already clocked that you were running low and placed an order with a company that has a warehouse operated by robot laborers and will deliver it straight to your front door. Would you prefer a driverless vehicle or flying drone for that order?

It's the world of physical AI, where robots provide advice and companionship, inspect nuclear reactors and bridges, clean the house, fight wars, perform surgeries, explore space and navigate the earthly world side by side with humans. And it's a future that leading AI experts will be pondering and mapping this week at the AI Horizons summit, the second major artificial intelligence event in Pittsburgh in less than three months.

Summit events begin Wednesday evening, followed by two days of programs Thursday and Friday at Bakery Square.

"It's people getting together from different sectors, trying to really table-set what actions need to happen, what asks need to be made, whether state or federal, in order to
