Police investigating as Westmoreland's Mears says hacker selling items from his page

People reporting their Facebook pages were hacked is a relatively common occur-

But the victims usually aren't Westmoreland County Common Pleas iudges.

Judge Scott Mears said his over the weekend.

A scammer made a post on the judge's page, claiming his uncle had recently entered an assisted living facility, and that he was selling his per-

The false post claimed the judge's uncle suffers from dementia and solicited money for items including vehicles, appliances, exercise equipment and furniture.

State police is investigating, the judge said. Requests made directly to Meta, the owners of Facebook, to remove the post have been unsuccessful,

"This story is fraudulent, and the items listed do not exist, Mears said in a statement. "I am urging residents to remain vigilant against these types of attacks and to report them to law enforcement immediately. Should anyone receive a friend request from me or a direct message soliciting interest in purchasing items, please do not accept the request and report all such outreach attempts to Meta directly."

Mears has been blocked from access to his Facebook page and can't delete the posts, several of which are soliciting

"This crime is particularly troubling because the hacker is exploiting the trust that people place in a judge. I want the public to know that I am doing everything within my power to stop this scam and prevent future harm," Mears said.

A spokesman for the state police did not respond to a request for comment.

Multiple reports

Facebook users across the country have reported similar occurrences, with increased frequency this year.

In the Reddit page r/Scams, a user posted about their account getting hacked, leading a mutual friend to send \$2,500

Pittsburgh Steelers fans will see a siew of Acrisure Stadium upgrades, new food options and technology improvements ahead of the upcoming NFL

The enhancements come before Pittsburgh hosts the 2026 NFL Draft in April. The weekend-long event is expected to bring hundreds of thousands of football fans to the city's North Shore and Downtown areas.

Trump set to send in guard

Chicago, Baltimore targeted as judge rules deployment to Los Angeles was unlawful

President Donald Trump said Tuesday that he's ready to order federal authorities to mobilize and combat crime in Chicago and Baltimore, despite staunch opposition from elected leaders and many residents in both cities.

Asked by reporters in the Oval Office

» More Nation and World news about sending National Guard troops to the nation's third-largest city, Trump said, "We're going in," but added, "I didn't say when.'

"I have an obligation," the president said. "This isn't a political thing."

Trump has already sent National Guard troops into Los Angeles and Washington, where he's also federalized the police force. He has said he plans similar moves in other Democrat-run cities even as a federal judge on Tuesday deemed the California deployment illegal.

In the 52-page ruling, U.S. District Judge Charles Breyer in San Francisco noted Trump and Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth have stated their intention to deploy National Guard troops to other cities across the country, including Oakland and San Francisco, and that raises concerns they are "creating a national police force with

Kraft Heinz to split but keep Pittsburgh, Chicago HQ's

Better-selling brands appear bound for same company

At least some part of Kraft Heinz will stay in Pittsburgh as the processed food conglomerate divides its brands into two new companies.

Kraft Heinz said Tuesday while announcing the split it has no plans to move its co-headquarters in Pittsburgh and Chicago.

That's about all the company

offered on keeping its longstanding ties to Southwestern Pennsylvania, where Heinz — and later Kraft Heinz

In 1869, Henry John Heinz started making horseradish in Sharpsburg. By 1888, he was producing ketchup under the H.J. Heinz Co. name. When he died in 1919, Heinz had more than two dozen factories in the U.S. and abroad.



Changes reportedly planned in the breakup of Kraft Heinz will have Heinz Ketchup under the same banner as Kraft Mac & Cheese.

Heinz ceased manufacturing at its North Side plant in 2000 but kept its corporate presence in Pittsburgh.

In 2015, it joined with Kraft in a \$23 billion deal that promised to bust stagnant growth through meticulous cost controls and economies of scale. But sluggish sales proved too much to overcome as consumers turned toward generic brands and, more broadly, away from processed foods.
