Ron Harman had finished backing his Jeep out of the driveway when he saw a bright red cardinal perched on the roof of Jeannie Seely's carport. He snapped a picture. Some believe a red cardinal is a comforting sign from heaven, a symbolic visit from someone who has died or a reminder that a loved one is still near. To Harman, it was his longtime friend letting him know she had made it to the other side. "That's Jeannie," he said. "She's telling me she's still here. A Grand Jury has indicted Murfreesboro Police Detective Reginal Primas after investigators found "discrepancies with drug funds," according to Aug. 5 law enforcement news releases. A Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) news release said the grand jury indicted Primas one day earlier on one count of theft, one count of forgery, two counts of falsifying a government document and 13 counts of official misconduct.
