UNT's winningest coach makes retirement plans

Hedlund launched women's soccer program in 1995

One of the great coaches in the history of North Texas athletics

has laid out his plans to retire. John Hedlund, one of the all-

time winningest coaches in all of women's college soccer, will call it a career after the 2026 season, his 32nd at UNT. The school made the announcement on Friday morning.


time, I will be a few months away from turning 65 and in the last year of my contract.

Homes coming next year

North Texas real estate developer Hillwood is making progress on what it calls its largest project to date — Landmark, a 3,200-acre residential and mixed-use development that will end with 6,000 single-family homes.

On Thursday evening, executives and local leaders, including

Hillwood details Phase 1 of Landmark, a \$10B development in southwest Denton

Mayor Gerard Hudspeth, officially introduced plans for Phase 1 of the development, which sits along Interstate 35W in southwest Denton

One of the major landmarks of

the development will be Denton's first H-E-B just steps from the property. The grocer is expected to complete building around the same time of Landmark Phase 1's

initial completion in 2026.

Formerly Hunter Ranch, the 3,200-acre property is one of the original land holdings purchased by the Perot family in 1987, according to Hillwood.

In this first phase, already underway at the corner of I-35W and Robson Ranch Road, Hillwood is planning more than 700
