## Texas Rangers investigating deadly shooting in Hale County

Texas Rangers are investigating a Saturday morning shooting in Hale County that left five people dead, including the suspected shooter.

Meanwhile, an online fundraiser for the family of one of the victims indicated the shooting came as an argument erupted at a family gathering in the community of Seth Ward just north of Plainview.

Hale County Sheriff's officials called on the Rangers to help with a death investigation Saturday in the Seth Ward neighborhood, according to a Texas Department of Public Safety news release.

Deputies responding to a home about 3:40 a.m. Saturday in the 2700 block of Upchurch found five people suffering from gunshot wounds, the release states.

Hector Alonso Sanchez, 28, Tanya Paola Valadez Rangel, 30, Rosalba Saenz Rodriguez, 47, died at the scene. Saul Villa, 33, who was identified as the

assailant, was also found dead at the scene, the release states.

Reily Joseph Zavala Barrientos, 21, was taken to Covenant Hospital-Plainview where he died, the release states.

Other information about the circumstances of the killings was not immediately clear.

The Texas Rangers investigation is ongoing, however, officials believe there is not threat to the public, the release states.

## NAACP, family call for arrests after student attacked

Local advocates for the Black community are decrying as an injustice the lack of arrests in connection with what they believe was a racially motivated beating of a 17-year-old Lubbock-Cooper high school student in January.

Meanwhile, officials with the Lubbock County Sheriff's Office say investigators are still looking into the alleged Jan. 17 assault on DeTayevion Lang during a bonfire gathering near Lubbock-Cooper Liberty High School.

## 14-year-old dies, four injured in rollover crash

A 14-year-old boy has died and four other teens were injured after a crash in Winkler County Sunday, the Texas Department of Public Safety announced Monday.

About 11:08 p.m. Sunday, a 2006 Chevrolet Silverado was driving eastbound on County Road 201 when it veered off the roadway, according to a news release from the DPS. The driver, a 13-year-old girl, attempted to steer it back, but the vehicle entered a side skid and rolled over.

Rumors quickly became real over the weekend, when the Alamo Drafthouse in Lubbock closed on Saturday, leaving people with questions.

Here's what to know about the closure of the location at 120 W Loop 289 Access Road.

### Why did Alamo Drafthouse close?

The cinema's website stated that the franchise partner, Triple Tap Ventures, will no longer operate the Houston, El Paso and Lubbock locations under the Alamo Drafthouse brand.

"We're grateful to the teammates and guests in El Paso, Katy, and Lubbock for their support over the years and wish them all the best," the website stated. "We hope to return to these communities in the future."
