Family raising funds to save 136-year-old Longview home from demolition

hese days, the white wooden home at 219 Clark St. in Longview's historical Preachers Hill neighborhood is obscured from view by tall trees and shrubs. But for most of its 136-year history, it was something to see - something its owners were proud of.

City officials have declared the home dangerous because of its structural deficiencies and health code violations. It needs major repairs, but it's worth saving because of its historical value, said 85-year-old Wilhelmina Fortner, one of the home's heirs.

If she and her relatives can devise a plan before Sept. 15 to make all the necessary repairs, the home can be spared. If not, it'll be demolished.

Fortner's great-grandmother, Ella Loyd, purchased the property and began building the home in 1889. She was a single mother of 12 children and the daughter of a freed slave; beyond that, owning property at that time was challenging for any woman – not to mention a Black woman, Fortner said.
