Texas Tech System set for leadership change

Board of Regents poised to name Creighton next chancellor

The Board of Regents of Texas Tech University System is set to name Texas State Sen. Brandon Creighton as the sole finalist for the 6th chancellor and CEO of the system. It comes after board chairman Cody Campbell announced on social media on Sunday that the Republican from Conroe and longtime state legislator would succeed current TTU System Chancellor Dr. Tedd Mitchell following

an extensive search process after Mitchell announced in early July he would retire within the year. “(Creighton) has been a strong voice

in the fight to get our colleges and universities back on track and clearly shares the values and the vision of the Texas Tech community,” Campbell said in his social media post. “We are confident that Senator Creighton will continue to advance our mission of serving students, driving research, and strengthening communities across the State, and especially in West Texas. He is, unquestionably, the right person for the job, and we all look forward to working with him.”

The Wichita County Commissioners Court on Tuesday voted to name the administrative offices of the Criminal Justice Center after retired Sheriff David Duke. “I believe that it is in the interest of the public to honor those with a long or particularly distinguished career of serving the public,” county Judge Jim Johnson said. New Sheriff Will Rutledge pointed out that Duke put in over 40 years of

The Wichita Falls-Wichita County Public Health District regularly monitors restaurants and food establishments for compliance with state food safety requirements.

Frequent inspections are essential in preventing the spread of foodborne illnesses through contamination and improper handling, storage and sanitation. Here are scores for retail food establishments, food stores, mobile food units and school, day-care and church establishments inspected Aug. 20-28.
