

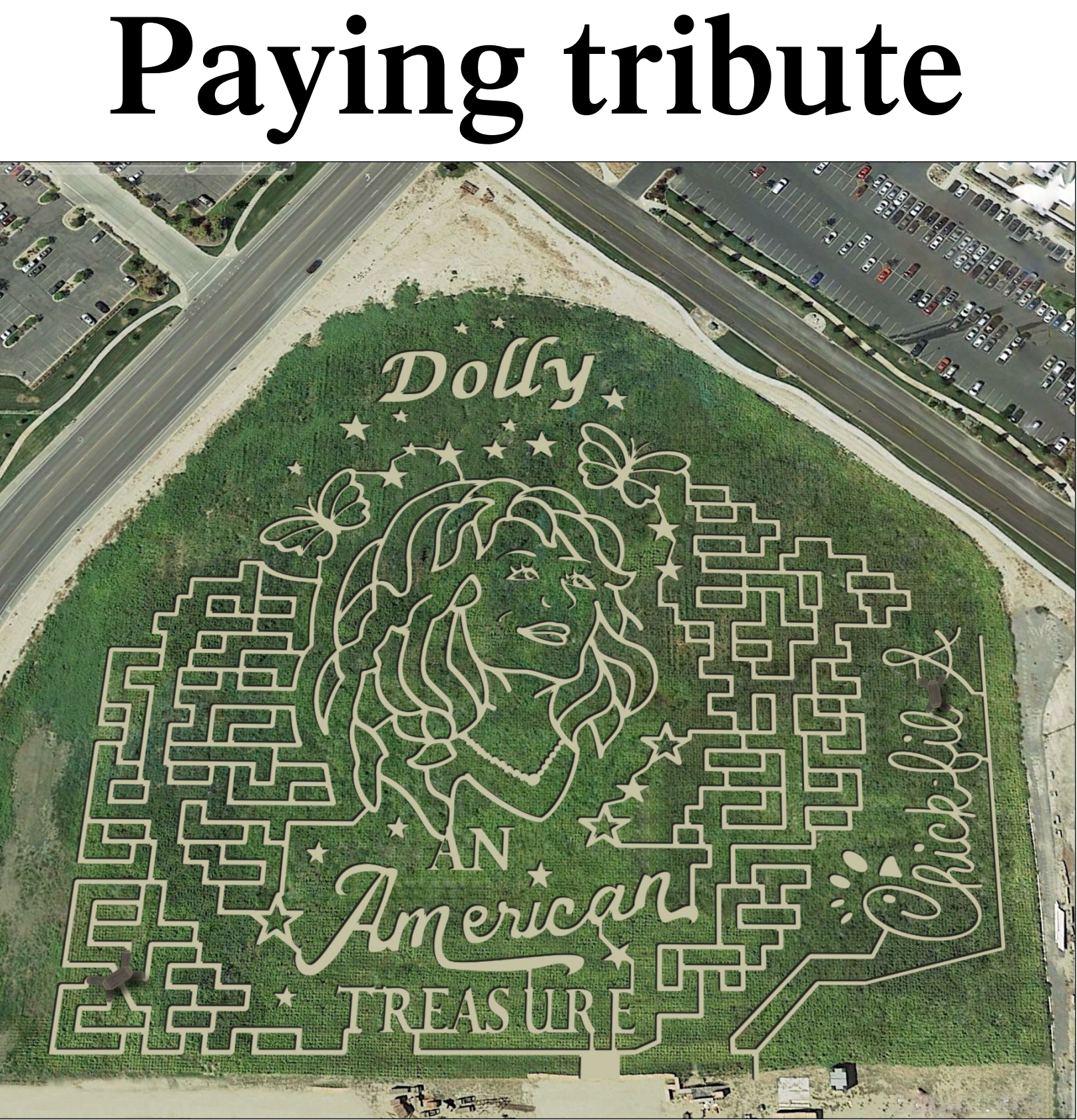

Cornbelly's to honor late Dolly Parton at Spanish Fork, Lehi mazes

Cornbelly's two Utah County corn mazes opening this month will pay tribute to a late American hero.

Dolly Parton, the iconic country singer and Imagination Library founder who died on Aug. 25, is featured in the design of Cornbelly's corn mazes in Spanish Fork and Lehi as well as several other The MAiZE Inc. mazes across the country.

The designs, planned prior to Parton's death, were intended to celebrate American 250 and

Parton's legacy.

"We are beyond humbled to honor Dolly's legacy, joining the world in mourning the passing of a true American treasure," said Brett Herbst, Cornbelly's owner and founder of The MAiZE Inc., in a news release. "Dolly's impact on the world and her love for farming is immeasurable and our corn maze tributes now take on new meaning and significance, as we honor her and her beloved Imagination Library."

The Spanish Fork maze, which opened last week, portrays Parton with the phrase "American 250" inscribed above her head. The

Lehi maze, opening Sept. 21, inscribes the phrase "An American Treasure" below a portrait of Parton.

While at the maze, visitors can play an interactive game that quizzes them on Dolly trivia, take photos with a life-size Parton photo op, and listen to Imagination Library storytelling sessions.

"I'm grateful for the support of my Imagination Library and am excited to invite people out to get lost in this year's country music corn

Peteetneet Fire near Payson reaches 60% containment

A wildfire ignited Sunday near Nebo Loop Road in Payson and grew to an estimated 45 acres before firefighters halted the blaze overnight.

Named the Peteetneet Fire, the blaze initially threatened structures, but air and ground resources quickly responded to the scene and there was no impact to infrastructure, according Utah Fire Info.

Overnight Sunday, crews worked to secure the perimeter, and continued suppression efforts Monday morning, authorities said. By Monday morning, the fire reached 60% containment.

Utah Fire Info said the fire as human caused, however, the specific cause remains under investigation.

63-year-old cyclist dies after being struck by vehicle in Provo

A 63-year-old man died after he was struck by a vehicle while riding his bike Monday morning in Provo.

At 8:16 a.m., Provo police responded to a crash at Lakeview Parkway and the University Avenue Interstate 15 off-ramp, where a vehicle exiting the freeway had collided with the cyclist, according to a news release.

The cyclist was transported to Utah Valley Hospital but died from his injuries.

"Our condolences are with his family and loved ones," Provo police said.

The Provo police traffic team responded to the scene and closed the roadway for most of the morning Monday while investigating, the news release said. The driver of the vehicle was cooperating with investigators and was not suspected to be driving under the influence, according to authorities.
