Actor-director Robert Redford dies at 89

Oscar winner also founded renowned Sundance Festival

Robert Redford, the Hollywood golden boy who became an Oscar-winning director, liberal activist and godfather for independent cinema under the name

of one of his best-loved characters, died Tuesday at 89.

Redford died "at his home at Sundance in the mountains of Utah - the place he loved, surrounded by those he loved," publicist Cindi Berger said in a statement. No cause of death was provided.

Redford was one of the biggest stars of the '70s with such films

Democrats still lead in fundraising

Spanberger, Hashmi both have advantage

Democrat Abigail Spanberger raised \$14 million between July 1 and Aug. 31, nearly three times as much as Republican Winsome Earle-Sears, as the campaign for governor reaches the homestretch.

Earle-Sears raised \$5.2 million in the period, according to the Virginia Public Access Project.

Spanberger had \$12.2 million in cash as of Aug. 31 to \$4.9 million for Earle-Sears, according to the latest campaign finance

confirm claim of harder tests

Youngkin said SOLs '30 to 40%' tougher

Gov. Glenn Youngkin said Virginia's Standards of Learning tests that students take each spring were 30%-40% harder this year, but his education department cannot provide any documentation that substantiates the claim.

Youngkin cited the state's assessment contractor, Pearson, in his assertion. In response to questions from the Richmond Times-Dispatch, Pearson would



not confirm nor deny the gover-
