Chesterfield County Public Schools invites the community to the fall marching band exhibition at Thomas Dale High School. Every Chesterfield County high school will be featured at the annual event with free admission on Oct. 6.

The event begins at 6:25 p.m. in Thomas Dale's stadium in Chester. Attendees will experience the bold sounds and precision moves of drumlines, brass and woodwinds alongside the beautiful choreography of color guards as 10 halftime shows march across the field.

This year's marching band exhibition will begin with the national anthem performed by band students from Carver, Elizabeth Davis, Falling Creek and Matoaca middle schools.

Cool deal for Chesterfield; refrigeration company plans expansion

A Georgia-based manufacturer of retail food refrigeration containers is planning a \$20 million expansion of its south Chesterfield County plant, company and state officials announced Sept. 29.

Dover Food Retail will expand its Hillphoenix facility on Ruffin Mill Road to relocate manufacturing operations of its other brand, Anthony, from Los Angeles. The expansion is expected to create more than 300 new jobs in the area.

Dover said in a statement that the move will add "all-new, state-of-the-art equipment" to the factory, expand research and development, and establish a distribution center for a new retail parts hub.

"This investment will build upon our strong foundation of Dover Food Retail's U.S.-based manufacturing capabilities, building on our commitment to delivering exceptional products to our customers and maintaining our position as the innovation leaders in the industry," Dover President Paul Sindoni said in a statement.

In the same statement, Gov. Glenn Youngkin called the move from California to Virginia "an incredible endorsement of the Commonwealth as a hub for advanced manufacturing."

Based in Conyers, Georgia, Dover Food Retail is a subsidiary of Dover Corp., headquartered in Downers Grove, Illinois. It employs more than 3,000 workers worldwide and has locations throughout the United States, Europe and Asia.

In addition to Hillphoenix and Anthony, the company also manufactures the AMS brand of retail refrigerators. Most of its customers are supermarkets and convenience stores.

The Hillphoenix facility in Chester-field was opened in 1995 and encompasses more than 450,000 square feet of space.
