### Trump's judges lawsuit tossed

Roanoke-based judge called targeting of 'potentially calamitous'

BALTIMORE - A Roanoke-based federal judge on Tuesday threw out the Trump administration's lawsuit against Maryland's entire federal bench in an emphatic ruling that underscored the extraordinary nature of the suit,

slamming it as "potentially calamitous."

U.S. District Judge Thomas Cullen, who was nominated President Donald Trump, also criticized the administration's attacks on the judiciary, highlighting in a footnote that White House officials in recent months had described judges Trump as "rogue," "un-



hinged" and "crooked," among

other epithets. "Although some tension between the coordinate branches of government is a hallmark of our constitutional system, this concerted effort by the Executive to smear and impugn individual judges who rule against it is both unprecedented and unfortunate," he wrote.

At issue in the lawsuit was an order by the chief judge of the Maryland district court that stopped the immediate deportation of migrants challenging their removals. The Justice
