‘Delightfully eclectic’

125-year-old Astor Park home with Belgian brick, dragon spouts on sale

One of Green Bay’s most ornate, iconic and unique homes is for sale for the first time in more than a decade. ● The Joannes House, 902 S. Madison St., is for sale for \$950,000, according to the Nov. 7 Realtor.com listing. The house was designed and built for Mitchell and Fannie Joannes who moved in in fall 1900 after about a year and a half of construction. ● The three-story home still stands out 125 years later, even in Green Bay’s history-laden Astor Park neighborhood. The 7,200-square-foot house joined the National Register of Historic Places in 1980 and the Wisconsin State Register of Historic Places in 1989. ● “I don’t know that there’s any home like this,” said Sandra Ranck, the listing agent the Joannes House for sale. “This is truly a Gilded Age mansion.”

After hours of debate, Green Bay’s short-term rental talks to start over

Green Bay’s attempts at further regulating short-term rentals are back to square one, after hours of debate.
