Kahlenberg Industries sits on the lonely corner of 12th and Monroe streets, a few blocks either way from West Twin River and Lake Michigan. The century-old warehouse in Two Rivers exudes plainness.

But virtually every day from early fall to late spring, in arenas large and small across the United States and Canada, it is an integral part in one of the singular traditions in all of sports.

From the NHL to minor leagues to college, even to some high schools, hockey – and hockey alone – proclaims each score with a loud horn blast.

And at countless hockey venues, including 26 of the 32 National Hockey League arenas, those horns come from Kahlenberg Industries.

The company doesn’t just make hockey horns. Kahlenberg’s website doesn’t even mention hockey.

Sales manager Alex Kahlenberg – great-great-grandson of one of the founders – noted that even the high-profile NHL teams amount to just over two

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## Warren demands details on TrumpRx deals

U.S. Sen. Elizabeth Warren is demanding that Health and Human Services Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. make public the details of drug-pricing deals with pharmaceutical companies that list medicines on President Donald Trump’s direct-to-consumer website, TrumpRx.

The Massachusetts Democrat said in an Aug. 13 letter to Kennedy that he hasn’t made details public even though he committed to doing so during an April hearing before the Senate Finance Committee.

“Americans deserve to know whether the deals the administration is cutting with Big Pharma will lower their pre-

scription drug costs – or just further enrich big drug companies,” Warren wrote in the letter obtained by USA TODAY.

Warren’s letter was sent a day after the Labor Department released a July inflation report showing prescription drug prices dropped 3.1% over the past 12 months. It was the steepest annual decline since March 1963, during the administration of President John F. Kennedy.

TrumpRx, launched earlier this year, is the centerpiece of Trump’s efforts to lower prescription drug costs for Americans. The Trump administration has announced “most-favored-nation” deals with 17 large pharmaceutical com-

panies aimed at lowering prescription drug costs to levels seen in other developed nations. In May, Trump announced more than 600 generic medications were added to the direct-to-consumer website.

However, the administration hasn’t released the terms of deals negotiated with drug companies.

TrumpRx doesn’t sell prescription drugs directly but lists prices and directs cash-paying consumers to drug manufacturers’ websites or to coupons that can be used at pharmacies. The site also doesn’t process insurance claims, and most people use their health insurance plan’s drug benefits when filling prescriptions.

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## Marshfield schools prepare for new year

The start of a new school year is just around the corner, and families across central Wisconsin are beginning to make their back-to-school plans. From school supply shopping and end-of-summer trips to adjusting schedules, the Marshfield News-Herald has compiled helpful information to make the transition a little easier.

Here is what students and families in the School District of Marshfield students need to know ahead of the first day of classes.

### When is the first day of class in the Marshfield school district?

School District of Marshfield students have their first day of school on Aug. 27.

### What time does the school day start and end?

Start and end times vary by grade level. Elementary school students begin their days at 7:45 a.m. or 7:55 a.m. and end at 2:40 p.m. or 2:50 p.m., depending on the building. Specific times can be found on each elementary school’s “General Information” website. The middle school begins at 7:45 a.m. and ends at 2:55 p.m. Marshfield High School students begin at 7:50 a.m. and end their days at 3:06 p.m.

### When are orientation days and open house times?

Elementary schools are holding open house events from 4:30-6 p.m. Aug. 25. Middle school students have a meet and greet night from 5:30-7:30 p.m. Aug. 26. Marshfield High School students have registration events Aug. 18-20 and a meet and greet event from 3:30-7:30 p.m. Aug. 20. Freshmen and new students have orientation at 5:30 p.m. Aug. 20.

### Where can I find school supply lists?

School supply lists can be found on the district website.

### Are there any new principals in the district?

The School District of Marshfield hired one new principal for the upcoming school year, Jennifer Heeg, administrative assistant to the superintendent and School Board, said in an email to a Marshfield News-Herald reporter.

Matthew Raduechel was hired to serve as principal of Marshfield High School to replace outgoing principal Jackson Hein. Radeuchel has nine years of experience as a school administrator, most recently serving for three years as principal of Shawano Community High School.
