STEVENS POINT – Applications are open for artists to exhibit at the 52nd annual Stevens Point Area Festival of the Arts.

The festival will be held April 12, 2026, at Artist & Fare in Plover, according to a community announcement. Fifty-four visual artists will be selected to showcase and sell their work.

STEVENS POINT – Stevens Point Brewery is introducing non-alcoholic versions of two popular brews, Point Amber NA and Point Snow Pilot Pistachio Nut Brown NA.

Both brews will be available in December in six-packs of 12-ounce cans, wherever Point Beers are sold.

The timing is intentional as it coincides with New Year's celebrations and Dry January, a movement where individuals abstain from alcohol for the first month of the year, according to a community announcement.

"This is more than just a trend," Ju-

lie Birrenkott, Stevens Point Brewery marketing director, said in the announcement. "It's about meeting drinkers where they are – whether for Dry January, health or personal preference – with options that don't compromise on taste. Now everyone can raise a glass to that."

Point Amber NA reimagines the brewery's iconic Amber Lager, offering sweet caramel malts and a delicate hop balance in a smooth, medium-bodied profile, according to the announcement. Point Snow Pilot Pistachio Nut Brown NA blends Mount Hood hops, nutty Maris Otter malt and pistachio.

"We didn't just want to make NA beer," brewmaster Mike Schraufnagel said. "We wanted to make NA beer that stands on its own. This process lets us honor the integrity of Point Amber and Snow Pilot, preserving what makes them special."

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
