'Udder'-ly

Wisconsin losing dairy farms but some persevere

Growing up on a dairy farm in North Prairie, Ryan Klussendorf could have been the fourth generation in that family-run business.

But in the 1990s, the Waukesha County land was transformed into a golf course and housing developments as agriculture gave way to suburban growth.

"I no longer had a farm to go back to," Klussendorf said about his parents exiting the business – as many others did then.

Wisconsin lost tens of thousands of dairy farms in the '90s. Farmers received inflation-adjusted milk prices that were 20% lower than they were in 1960, and about half of the peak price in 1979, according to the University of Wisconsin-Madison Extension.
