## **Mixed** results at state **Capitol**

Yes to prevention but no to tighter gun laws

In the immediate aftermath of the shooting at Abundant Life Christian School last December, in which a 15-yearold student killed a teacher and a student and wounded six others before shooting herself, there were renewed calls to address gun violence in Wisconsin.

Federal, state and local officials condemned the shooting, state lawmakers reintroduced gun safety proposals, and hundreds of high school students - well-versed in active shooter drills and lockdowns marched to the Capitol to demand action.

Nearly a year after the Dec. 16, 2024, shooting, the results have been a mixed bag.

The vast majority of bills proposed by Democratic lawmakers, including measures seeking to impose universal background checks or red flag laws, have gained little traction in the GOP-controlled Legisla-
